SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

After inhalation

Remove casualty to fresh air and keep warm and at rest. If breathing is irregular or stopped, administer artificial respiration. If experiencing respiratory symptoms: Call a doctor.

After contact with skin

Wash with plenty of water. Immediately remove any contaminated clothing, shoes or stockings.

After contact with eyes

Rinse immediately carefully and thoroughly with eye-bath or water. In case of eye irritation consult an ophthalmologist.

After ingestion

Observe risk of aspiration if vomiting occurs. Rinse mouth immediately and drink plenty of water. Medical treatment necessary. Do NOT induce vomiting.

7.1. Precautions for safe handling
