SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

2.1. Classification of the substance or mixture

CLP: The product is not classified.

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Inhalation: Move into fresh air and keep at rest. In case of persistent throat irritation or coughing or after inhalation of oil mist: Seek medical attention and bring along these instructions.

Skin contact: Remove contaminated clothing immediately and wash skin with soap and water. In case of rashes, wounds or other skin disorders: Seek medical attention and bring along these instructions.
Product that under high pressure has been forced under the skin causes a serious situation and requires IMMEDIATE hospital treatment.

Eye contact: Immediately flush with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Remove any contact lenses and open eyelids widely. If irritation persists: Seek medical attention and bring along these instructions.

Ingestion: Immediately rinse mouth and drink 1-2 glasses of water or milk. Keep person under observation. Do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs, keep head low. Immediate transport to hospital. Bring along these instructions.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1. Precautions for safe handling

Safe handling advice: In case of spills, beware of slippery floors and surfaces.
Observe good chemical hygiene practices. Avoid prolonged and repeated contact with oil, particularly used oil.
Always remove oil with soap and water or skin cleaning agent, never use organic solvents. Do not use oil-contaminated clothing or shoes, and do not put rags moistened with oil into pockets.

Technical measures: Use work methods which minimise oil mist production.

Technical precautions: When working with heated oil, mechanical ventilation may be required.

7.2. Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Technical measures for safe storage: No special precautions.

Storage conditions: Store in tightly closed original container in a dry, cool and well-ventilated place.

Respiratory equipment: In case of inadequate ventilation or risk of inhalation of oil mist, suitable respiratory equipment with combination filter (type A2/P3) can be used.

Hand protection: Risk of splashes: Wear protective gloves.
Nitrile gloves are recommended.
Thickness: 0,8 mm; Breakthrough time: 240 min.
The most suitable glove must be chosen in collaboration with the supplier of gloves, who can inform about the breakthrough time of the glove material.

Eye protection: Risk of contact: Wear goggles/face shield.

Hygiene measures: Wash hands after contact.
Wash contaminated clothing before reuse.
